

Loving LUTHERANS CHALLENGE

Activity List for CHILDREN Listed below are some ideas to consider to engage your congregation as you participate in the Loving Lutherans Challenge. Feel fee to pick and choose which ones work best for you or incorporate some of your own favorite activities.

Let Your Light Shine

Make Heart shaped suncatchers and hang in windows. Using one part school glue and one part black paint, trace a "leaded glass" design onto a piece of sturdy clear plastic (recycled from a plastic container works well). Once dry, use permanent markers to color in the sections of the suncatcher.

Loving Lutherans Coloring page:

Print off copies of the Loving Lutherans/Luther Seal page and hand out during children's sermons or in Sunday School.

Together our Hearts are Stronger:

Create Danish woven hearts of paper or fabric, combining two halves and weaving the bottom section together like a basket. This can be ornaments, magnets, gift card holders, etc. and taken to members in care facilities. Consider hanging them on a tree of branches in your welcoming/fellowship area to display until they are distributed.

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Activity List for ALL AGES

Listed below are some ideas to consider to engage your congregation as you participate in the Loving Lutherans Challenge. Feel fee to pick and choose which ones work best for you or incorporate some of your own favorite activities.

Banner of Love

Create a large banner using newsprint or a large sheet of paper so all members of the congregation can participate. Use cut out hearts in a variety of colors and invite members to write a messages on them sharing how they are a Loving Lutheran (pray for those in need, quilt/knit/create comfort items for others, serve as a volunteer, teach others about God's love, etc.), how they see a need for love (hungry or homeless in community, refugees, people struggling with addictions, etc.), or how they pledge to love others as Lutherans (help with youth in need, donate to Lutheran Social Services, serve as a foster parent, etc.). Place all the hearts on the large paper and display in a common area of your church, like a fellowship or entrance area, to remind all about what it means to be a Loving Lutheran.

On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand

Decorate river rocks with Loving Lutherans messages on them and scatter them about the community for others to find. These can be painted with hearts, Luther's Seal, or bible verses and distributed. An alternative is to decorate smaller ones and make pocket prayer rocks to remind us of the foundation of our faith.

Pocket Hugs/Pocket Prayers

Decorate small items either in heart shapes or with hearts and attach a poem. These are meant to be kept in a pocket or purse to be brushed upon and reminders to love as Lutherans are called to do. Small flat glass marbles, soft quilted fabric hearts, or other small items can be used in this way by Lutherans young and old.

Community Quilt With Personalized Squares

Ask members of your congregation, or Sunday School students, to create a square and piece them all together into a quilt. Heart shaped appliques or handprints in fabric paint can include messages or symbols of love and ministry. Perhaps include a center block with Luther's Seal as a reminder of our calling as Loving Lutherans. This can be hung in your welcome/fellowship area or donated to a local charity.
